Notable 2020 Accomplishments

- Committed to raising \$25,000 to help students reduce the cost of dual credit/AP college courses while enrolled at Fort Osage High School.
- Raised over \$10,000 to purchase back-to-school supplies for needy families during the COVID crisis.
- Participated in the USDA Farmers to Families Food Box program.
- Held our first online auction in place of our annual Red Barn Bash and successfully generated \$13,000 in total receipts from this event.
- Offered internship to Maddy Preston from University of Central Missouri as she pursues a degree in Digital Media Production.

KC SCHOLARS

- KC Scholars began in 2016 and is creating life-changing opportunities for thousands of individuals and is positively transforming the region's workforce and economy. This innovative program helps low and modest-income high school students attend college.
- The Fort Osage Education Foundation began partnering in this program in 2019, committing \$2,500 per year for five years, totaling \$12,500. Combined with outside contributions, this will generate \$50,000 in total scholarship monies for a deserving Fort

Osage student.







Dual Credit / AP Assistance

- This is a new program introduced for the 2020-2021 school year to help students offset the cost of taking college classes while enrolled in high school. Fort Osage currently partners with University of Missouri-Kansas City, University of Central Missouri, and Metropolitan Community College.
- In the fall of 2020, 67 students enrolled in dual credit courses. The Foundation provided \$11,025 in scholarships reducing the student burden from \$36,000 to \$24,975. The scholarships were between \$75-\$150 per class taken.
- The Foundation has contributed \$3,020 towards 151 AP exam fees reducing the student burden from \$11,906 to \$8,886. The scholarships were \$20 per exam. That reduced the fee for students to either \$66 or \$33 per exam based on their family income.











• Fort Osage Education Foundation participates annually with this coupon card program, which typically raises between \$10,000 and \$13,000 for the school district.







Get on the Bus

• This payroll deduction program allows employees to contribute a set amount from each paycheck to the Foundation. Through generous support from employees across the district, we were able to generate \$9,695 in revenue in 2020.





Red Barn Bash Online Auction

- While we missed our annual Red Barn Bash this year, the silent auction was a big success!
- Over 75 great items to bid on, and combined with sponsorships and other individual donations, we raised just over \$13,000.
- Thank you to our major sponsors, to those who donated items for the auction, to our bidders, to our committee volunteers, and to other individuals who made a cash donation.

Back-to-School Supplies Campaign

- This was a new program introduced this year to assist families in our communities impacted by COVID.
- Through the tremendous generosity of almost 100 individuals throughout the entire school community, we raised over \$10,000.


